THE BRO^ADMOOR NAMED ONE OF GOLF LETTER'S GLOBAL TEN BRO^ADMOOR Honored as # 6 Greatest Golf Resort in World

Colorado Springs, CO (Spring/ Summer 2008)...The BRO^ADMOOR is pleased to add a distinguished award to its list of accolades for the resort and its championship golf. In the September issue, *Gary Galyean's Golf Letter* named The BRO^ADMOOR the sixth greatest golf resort in the world, highlighting the resort's "perseverance for perfection" and the East Course's "competitive pedigree."

"It's quite an honor for The BRO^ADMOOR to be included in this top ten list of memorable, superb golf resorts around the world," said Stephen Bartolin, Jr., President and CEO of The BRO^ADMOOR. "As *Golf Letter* notes, Director of Golf Russ Miller and his staff deserve the credit for placing The BRO^ADMOOR in such outstanding company."

In its 18th year, Golf Letter picked these distinguished, renowned resorts for its 2007 The Global Ten:

Credited by his "refinement, anticipation, efficiency, and polite behavior", by the editors of *Golf Letter*, Miller and the East Course he manages will play host to the U.S. Senior Open in 2008 and the U.S. Women's Open in 2011.

The BRO^ADMOOR is home to three superb and challenging championship golf courses. Originally designed by Donald Ross in 1917, the East Course is a championship golf course in the true sense of the word. When completed in 1918, BRO^ADMOOR East course was the highest golf course in the United States at 6,400 feet in elevation. It is now a combination of the original Donald Ross design mixed in with holes designed by Robert Trent Jones, Sr. in 1965. A more forgiving course

than BRO^ADMOOR West, the East course is known for its wide fairways and large greens. The East Course was one of only 12 North American and Caribbean golf courses to receive a five-star rating by Golf Digest. The BRO^ADMOOR East Course has been home to many major tournaments including the 1959 U.S. Amateur which saw Jack Nicklaus' first major win, the 1964 U.S. Amateur and more recently the 1995 U.S. Women's Open which gave Annika Sorenstam her first major title.

A combination of the original 1918 Donald Ross design and the Robert Trent Jones Sr. 1965 design, the West Course offers guests a challenging course with spectacular views. Rolling fairways and multilevel greens overlook both the city and the mountains. The West Course was the host site of the 1998 PGA Cup Matches.

Created by Nicklaus Design to incorporate the natural beauty of the area, the Mountain Course is a challenging test of golf from the back tees, but player-friendly from the forward and middle tees. It's a course that everyone will enjoy playing, and one whose scenic beauty is virtually unparalleled.
