Colorado Springs, CO (Spring/ Summer 2008)...Presidents, politicians, celebrities, athletes – and some of the greatest names in golf. Over the years, they've all played the historic courses at The BRO^ADMOOR. Consistently ranked among the best in the world, the courses have challenged them all. BRO^ADMOOR owner Spencer Penrose and his friends were responsible for raising more than \$1 million. This featured BRO^ADMOOR Golf Professionals 'Long' Jim Barnes and Chick Evans versus Warren Wood and Jock Hutchinson. \$10,000 was raised on that day alone! The Trans-Mississippi Championship was played in 1927 and six additional times after that. Since then, The BRO^ADMOOR has been the premier venue for a number of exciting tournaments.
