## **INTRODUCING THE BRO<sup>A</sup>DMOOR GOLF PROFESSIONALS**

### **RUSS MILLER: DIRECTOR OF GOLF**

Russ Miller joined The BRO<sup>A</sup>DMOOR as Director of Golf in May, 1998 after serving for seven years as Director of Golf at Landfall Club in Wilmington, North Carolina. A professional with vast experience, Miller oversees all golf-related activities at The BRO<sup>A</sup>DMOOR including tournament management, instructional programs, membership activities, staff training, retail operations, as well as the locker room and valet operations.

Mr. Miller is a member of the Professional Golfer's Association, with a class A rating, and was the recipient of the 2000, 2001 and 2003 Colorado PGA Merchandiser of the Year Award, the 2003 P.G.A National Merchandiser of the Year Award and the Colorado Hall of Fame award for Golf Person of the Year in 2004. He has utilized his golf expertise by serving on various committees of the PGA and has been involved in hosting such events as well as the 1998 PGA Cup Matches at The BRO<sup>A</sup>DMOOR and the Shell's Wonderful World of Golf at both Gaillardia Country Club in Oklahoma City and Querencia Golf Club in Los Cabos, Mexico. Mr. Miller will oversee the 2008 United States Senior Open, to be held at The BRO<sup>A</sup>DMOOR.

Mr. Miller holds a degree in Marketing and Professional Golf Management from Ferris State University in Michigan. He was a member of the university's golf team for three years as well as team captain.

### **MARK KELBEL: HEAD GOLF PROFESSIONAL**

Mark Kelbel came to Colorado Springs from Michigan where he served for seven years as Head Professional at the Grand Hotel Golf Club on Mackinac Island. One of four golf professionals in his family, Mr. Kelbel began working in the golf business 26 years ago in his father's pro shop. He apprenticed for three years at Hole-in-the-Wall Golf Club, and in 1994 Mr. Kelbel taught golf in Germany for a season. He has instructed numerous celebrities including Don Knotts, Branford Marsalis, the late Tip O'Neil, as well as many other governors and U.S. senators. After graduating from Michigan State University, where he received his degree in Advertising, Mr. Kelbel was honored by the PGA for being in the top 2% of his business school. This recognition helped to achieve his PGA Class A rating. Mr. Kelbel has been a member of the PGA since 1993.

## **CATHY MATTHEWS: OPERATIONS GOLF PROFESSIONAL**

Cathy Matthews began honing her golfing skills in her hometown of Corner Brook, Newfoundland in Canada. A graduate of Iowa State University with a Bachelor of Science degree in Exercise and Sport Science, Ms. Matthews was a three-time academic All-American, four-year Varsity letter winner and co-captain of the women's golf team. After graduation, she joined the staff of the Hole-In-The-Wall Golf Club in Naples, Florida as an assistant professional, and then moved to The BRO<sup>A</sup>DMOOR in 1999 as Assistant Professional. In 2002, Ms. Matthews graduated from the PGA Management Program and was the Titleist Apprentice Scholarship winner for the state of Colorado. In 2006, Ms. Matthews was awarded "Top 25 Assistant Professional" by *Golf World Magazine*.

## **FRED DICKMAN: DIRECTOR GOLF COURSE MAINTENANCE**

Fred Dickman joined The BRO<sup>A</sup>DMOOR in June, 1997 as Director of Golf Course Maintenance. Mr. Dickman has over twenty years expertise in course maintenance, construction, grow-in, and renovation.

Before joining The BRO<sup>A</sup>DMOOR, Mr. Dickman was Head Golf Course Superintendent at The Phoenician Resort in Scottsdale, Arizona and consulted on maintenance operations for other ITT-Sheraton properties. He directed construction of the Phoenician and other courses in the Phoenix area.

Mr. Dickman has been a Certified Golf Course Superintendent since 1996 and an active member of the Golf Course Superintendents Association of America. He is an Audubon International Colorado State Steward and serves on the advisory board to several horticulture publications.
